Curriculum Plan for Year 4 – Summer Term 2022

English	Your child will undertake a variety of grammar, punctuation, spelling, speaking and listening and writing activities, based on the following genres: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Issues and dilemmas - Stories by the same author - Non-fiction, instruction texts & diary writing e.g. discussing dilemmas - Information books linked to other curriculum areas. Examination of these texts will support the teaching of spelling, vocabulary, grammar, punctuation, composition and comprehension.
Maths	Shape – 2D symmetry, reflections Position - coordinates and translations Statistics - bar charts, line graphs and reading information in tables. Factors, multiples and prime numbers Two step word problems using all four operations and measures. Fractions - solving problems involving fractions Area and perimeter - consolidate knowledge and apply when solving problems.
Science	Electricity - looking at mains and battery appliances, how to make a circuit and what materials conduct electricity. Sound - how are sounds produced? How pitch and volume can be changed.
PSHCE	Relationships and changing me - the children think about different relationships we have in our lives, such as with friends and family. They think about how we can deal with loss and show others that we care. The children learn about how we change emotionally and physically as we grow older and learn about the changes that occur in puberty.
Technology	Studying, designing and photo frames.

Geography	Europe
Art	A range of activities using a variety of mediums which will compliment work in other areas. Studying Vincent Van Gogh and working in his style. Observational pencil drawings.
