



Curriculum Plan for Year 3 – Autumn Term 2022

English	This term, Year 3 children will be reading 'Stone Age Boy' and using this as a stimulus to write their own story setting. They will be learning about the features of non-fiction books and then writing a non-fiction report about an imaginary 'prehistoric' creature that they will make from plasticine. Our poetry work will involve studying a classic poem 'When Daddy fell into the Pond' by Alfred Noyes and we will also explore performance poetry, shape poetry and poems containing alliteration. All these units of work will support the teaching of spelling, vocabulary, grammar, punctuation, composition and comprehension.

Homework	Daily reading; Weekly spelling & times tables test. 30 mins Maths activity; 30 mins English activity. The VLE will be used once the children have been set up with their required details.
